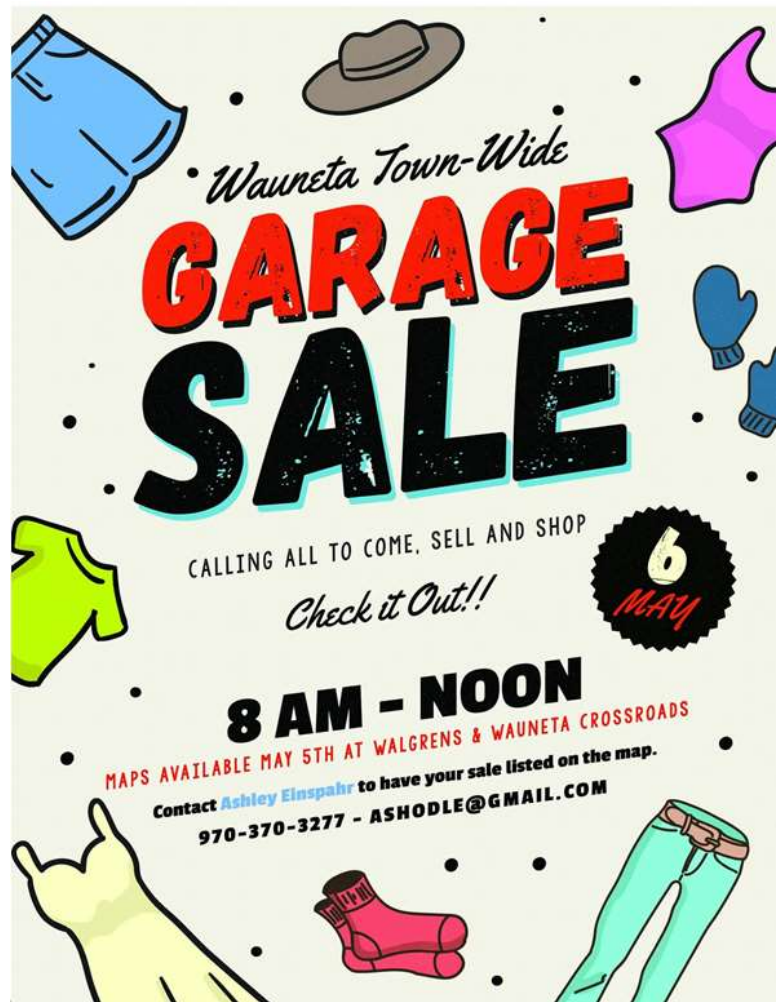

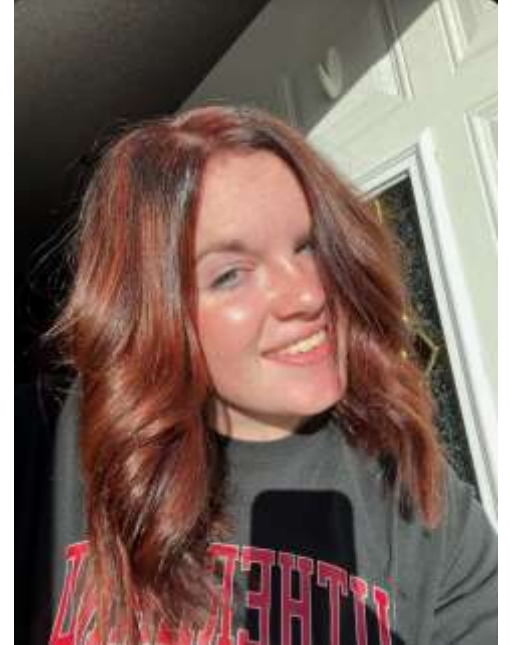

Village of Wauneta, Nebraska

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on **March 14, 2023**, at the Wauneta Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: C Walgren, R Einspahr, P Johnston, B Kramer. Absent: B Goings.

Guests: Arlan Wine (Village Attorney) and Michael Hoback (AMGL).

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on March 9, 2023. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Michael Hoback, AMGL, gave a presentation and reviewed the financial statements and audit report for the Village of Wauneta, for the year ending Sept 30, 2022.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on Feb 13, 2023.

Board approved Treasurer's Report (Feb) and approved bills (March) as presented.

Bischoff gave a status update on the Emergency Water Main Replacement to the Village Board.

Board approved the "Application for Payment" No. 1, payable to BSB Construction, in the amount of \$52,101.34 for the Emergency Water Main Replacement.

Board accepted and approved the bid from Maguire Iron, in the amount of \$230,500.00, for the cleaning and painting of the Water Reservoir.

Chairman Johnston reviewed the Nursing Home's financial reports for Jan 2023 and the committee meeting report with the Village Board.

Board approved Janice Edwards as the interim Administrator for WCTC. (Edwards will split her time between Wauneta and the Benkelman nursing home)

Board approved the purchase of a new vital sign monitoring machine, from MME in the amount of \$795, for the Nursing Home.

Board approved the purchase of replacement lighting for the Nursing Home from CED. (Approximate cost \$6800)

Board granted permission to RHD, to complete the necessary paperwork, so that the facility (WCTC) can file for the Employee Retention Credit.

Bischoff and Skelton gave an update on the status of the HVAC Project at the Nursing Home to the Village Board.

The Board reviewed the Chase County Sheriff's Report for February 2023.

Board approved request for a Special Designated Liquor License, received from the Wauneta Chamber of Commerce, for a Benefit/Fund Raiser Event, to be held at the Wauneta Community Building on Saturday, April 1, 2023.

March 14, 2023

The Village Board discussed a "New Construction Grant", which Southwest Nebraska Community Betterment will be applying for. There was no action taken.

Superintendent Bischoff presented a letter of resignation to the Board. The Board accepted Bischoff's resignation, effective June 1, 2023.
