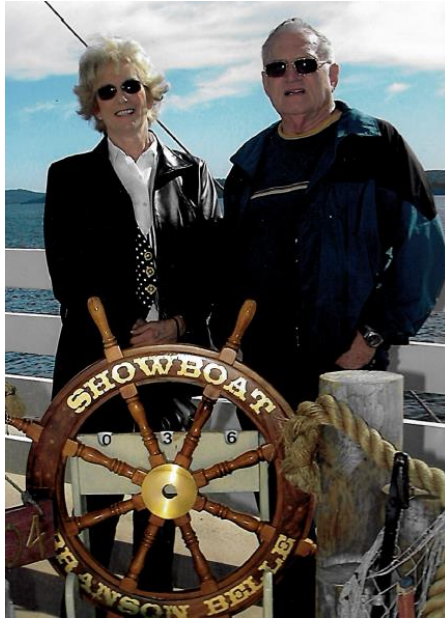

LIBRARY NEWS

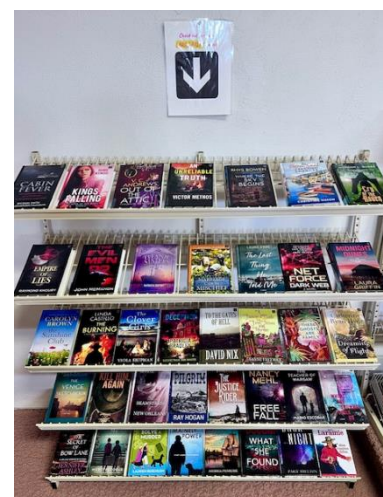
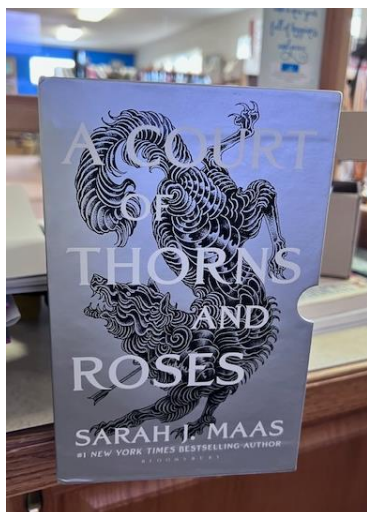
Happy April! I hope Spring finds you well and thriving and enjoying all the beautiful perks that come with this time of year.

RECIPES BY RHONDA

Easy 30-Minute Homemade Chicken Tortilla Soup

10 small corn tortillas cut into ¼ inch wide strips

2 tablespoons olive oil

1 teaspoon kosher salt or to taste

Soup

2 TBSP olive oil

1 Cup Sweet Vidalia or yellow onion peeled and diced small (about 2 medium onion)

1 large jalapeno pepper (about 4 to 5 inches long, diced very small (the seeds are where the heat is concentrated; included or discard them based on preference)

4 garlic cloves peeled and finely minced

32 ounces 4 cups low sodium chicken broth

2 14.5 ounce can black beans drained and rinsed

2 cups shredded cooked chicken (use store bought rotisserie chicken to save time; or roast or cook your own chicken or use other leftover chicken you have on hand)

1 ½ cups corn (I used frozen straight from the freezer, or use canned corn that's drained, or fresh may be substituted)

1 TBSP lime juice plus more to taste if desired

1 TBSP chili powder

2 tsp cumin

2 tsp salt or to taste

1 tsp black pepper

1 tsp smoked paprika (regular paprika may be substituted)

¼ tsp cayenne pepper

1/3 cup fresh cilantro leaves finely minced

Diced avocado for serving

Shredded cheese optional for serving

Sour cream optional for serving

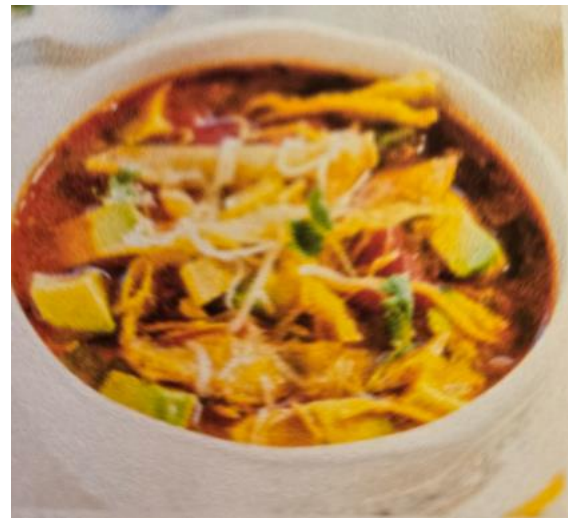
Instructions

Make the Tortilla Strips

1. Preheat oven to 375F and line a baking sheet with a Silpat or foil to save cleanup time.
2. Loosely scatter the tortilla strips, evenly drizzle with olive oil, evenly sprinkle with kosher salt, toss with hands to coat evenly, and bake for about 15 to 18 minutes or until crisp and lightly golden brown; set aside.
3. While strips bake, begin making the soup.

Make the Soup

1. To a large Dutch oven or stockpot, add 2 TBSP olive oil and heat over medium high heat to warm.
2. Add the onion, jalapeno, and sauté for about 5 minutes, or until vegetables begin to soften. Stir intermittently.
3. Add the garlic and sauté for 1 to 2 minutes. Stir intermittently.
4. Add the chicken broth, tomatoes and juice, black beans, chicken, corn, lime juice, chili powder, cumin, 2 tsps salt, pepper, smoked paprika, optional cayenne pepper, and bring to a boil.
5. Allow mixture to boil gently for about 5 to 7 minutes. If at any point the overall liquid level looks low or you prefer your soup to have more broth, add 1 to 2 cups of water; you'll adjust the salt and seasoning levels at the end.
6. Add the cilantro and boil 1 minute.
7. Taste soup and add salt to taste. This will vary based on how salty the chicken broth, tomatoes, black beans, and rotisserie chicken are, and personal preference. Make any necessary seasoning adjustments.
8. Ladle soup into bowls, top with tortilla strips to taste, optionally furnish with avocado, cheese and/or sour cream; serve immediately.

Dear Editor,

We would like to share some information about a proposed solar farm near Enders with the people of Chase County. A company called Ranger Power is wanting to build a 3,200-acre solar project within a 3 mile by 3 ½ mile area. The company has named this project Sand Draw Solar. This is agricultural land, mostly on hillside. The north boundary is Old 6, the west boundary Hwy 6, east boundary 339 Ave, and on south, it comes to about ½ mile from southern Hwy 6. Currently there are 5 land owners who have purchase options with the company. Tom Luhrs, Duane Dinnel, W.O. Sharp Farms, Bar S. (R. Schultz) and Johnston Bros. The Nebraska Board of Educational Lands and Funds will have an extended lease on their section.

We are not against green energy. We are against damage to our eco-system, the land, our friends' and neighbors' property. We moved to the country for our views, for the peace, and the quiet; and to see wildlife, geese flying over and to hear the sounds of nature. Growing up on farm and ranch, we are concerned about conservation and ecological problems. The scale of this proposed solar farm is far removed from what is green. We feel erosion will be bad, both water and wind. Recycling of solar panels is almost nonexistent. The process is complex, costly and not widely implemented due to lack of infrastructure. Landfills are the most usual mode of disposal. A 3,200-acre solar farm will contain 3.2 to 4.8 million panels depending on panel size and type. Life expectancy of a panel is 20-30 years. If anyone questions any of the information included, we will be glad to provide the sources and more.

These solar panels will be visible from the Enders Golf Course, Enders Lake, lake cabins, Enders, Imperial, and most of the homes in the valley for miles. What does this do to our home and land values, tourism, and bringing people to our county for recreation and to live? This does not lower our energy cost or increase energy available to us. This power will go to Omaha via NPPD lines. No long-term increase of employment will occur. A small group of maintenance workers will remain.

We are not against progress for our county. Those who want to gain financially at the cost of rural living and disregarding the land is difficult to accept. Landowners have a right to do what they want with their property, but not at the cost of their neighbors' future.

Thankfully, there are several owners who chose not to enter into this agreement. We call these land owners "Stewards of the Land". They give us hope and friendship. We also have many people throughout the county who have shown their concern and care for Chase County. We appreciate them.

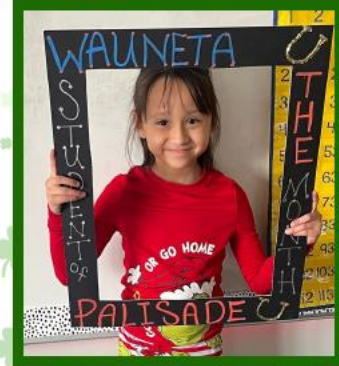
Sawyor Bardsley

6-8 Student of the Month

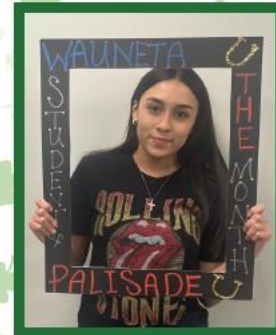
Myka Applegarth

Discussions held prior to official meeting (prior to quorum):

Michael Hoback, AMGL, gave a presentation and reviewed the financial statements and audit report for the Village of Wauneta, for the year ending September 30, 2024. Hoback went through the report in detail with the present Board members. Hoback also reviewed several benchmarking ratios to show how the Village of Wauneta compares to towns with comparable populations.

RaNae Richardson and Kerchal gave a report of the Jan 2025 Wauneta Care and Therapy (WCTC) Financial Reports and Committee Meeting.

Sheriff's Report (Feb 2025) was reviewed with Deputy Mike Dukes.

Wauneta EMS members (Leanne Klein, Jason Arellano) were present. A new ambulance has been ordered for Wauneta, which is larger than the current units. Klein and Arellano presented requests/quotes for the following upgrades to the Ambulance Building.

- Widen west bay door to accommodate new ambulance, \$15,500.00
- Replace lighting in the Ambulance bay, \$960.00
- Upgrade cabinets in supply room, \$13,299.00
- Repair damage to meeting room (due to roof leak), \$885.00

Official Board Meeting Minutes:

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at **7:50 p.m.** on **March 11, 2025**, at the Wauneta Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Vice Chairman Rick Einspahr publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on Feb 11, 2025; and the minutes of the special meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on Feb 21, 2025.

Board approved the Treasurer's Report (Feb) and approved bills (March as presented).

Board approved the proposal from Nebraska Safety & Fire for monitoring equipment for the fire alarm panel (WCTC); \$2,353.00 for the equipment and installation, and a \$45 monthly monitoring charge.

Board approved a wage increase for the Nursing Home Administrator (R. Richardson) salary.

Board accepted and approved the proposal received from JK Energy Consulting, LLC, to complete a "Cost of Service/Rate Design Study" for the Electric Department. The "Cost of Rate" study is \$8,000.00.

Board rescinded the previous motion to approve the wage increase for the Nursing Home Administrator Salary.

The Board discussed ongoing nuisance properties, including vacant businesses on main street and follow-up letters to be sent to several residential properties.

Clerk's Report was given by Skelton.

Superintendent's Report was given by Lawless.

Discussion held on possible upgrades/improvements to the Community Building, including equipment needs and street front upgrades (paint).
