Wild Rice Soup

- 2/3 cup uncooked wild rice, rinsed
  1 cup finely grated potatoes
  1 medium onion, minced
  2 cups water
  2 TBSP butter
  1 quart milk
- Optional Corn Black beans

2 TBSP all purpose flour
1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp salt
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp pepper
1 tsp parsley flakes
8 ounces processed cheese, such as Velveeta
10 strips of bacon, browned, drained and crumbled

Cover wild rice with water in a medium-size saucepan. Simmer over low heat, about 40 minutes until rice is barely tender; taking care not to overcook. Drain and set aside. Combine water and butter in a soup kettle. Add grated potatoes and minced onions. Reserving <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup milk, pour remaining milk into soup kettle. Stir often to avoid scorching. Add flour to remaining milk and stir into kettle until soup is creamy and smooth in texture. Season with salt and pepper. Stir in rice, parsley flakes, cheese and bacon, corn and beans. Heat until cheese melts.

Serves 8 to 10.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: B Kramer, C Walgren, R Einspahr, P Johnston. Absent: B Goings.

Guests: Arlan Wine, Angela Geihsler, RaNae Richardson (WCTC)

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on Dec 5, 2024. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on November 12, 2024.

Board approved the Treasurer's Report (Nov) and approved bills (Dec) as presented.

Board acknowledged the change of ownership of Good Times Bar & Grill to 100% ownership by Angela Geihsler; and to approve that this ownership carries over to KENO operations.

Kramer, Walgren and RaNae Richardson reported on the Nursing Home Committee meeting, including review of the August 2024 Financial Reports.

Board approved wage increases for WCTC Department Heads, as recommended by Richardson; Gary Hunt, Julie Hardy and Elisa Browne.

Board approved Christmas bonuses for Nursing Home employees based on Richardson's recommendation.

Board approved Resolution No. 2024-05, a resolution to authorize signing the Year-End Certification of Street Superintendent (Greg Wolford).

Board approved Christmas bonuses, to be paid in chamber bucks or gift cards.

Board approved Resolution 2024-06, a resolution authorizing the sale of personal property. The following property will be offered for sale: 1990 Ford Diesel Dump Truck; 2001 Bush Hog Mower – Zero Turn, Model D72-1; 1953 Catepillar #12 Grader/Maintainer; CMC Chipmore Chipper; Ride-on/pull-behind Sod/Asphault Packer. The Village of Wauneta will use an on-line auction service, Big Iron.

Skelton and Lawless gave an update on Nuisance properties that have previously been discussed. They will follow up on nuisances to make sure progress is being made on cleanup.

Clerk's Report given by Skelton. Skelton reported that the ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funds must be fully obligated by December 31, 2024. Projects already funded include a generator for one of the new wells, HVAC at the Ambulance Barn, elevator repairs at the Village office and new carpet at the Village office. The funds remaining to be obligated is approximately \$9000.00. Skelton and Lawless will check into the purchase of a SCBA air tank for the Fire Department.

Superintendent's Report given by Lawless.

The Board discussed the pending Vacancy on the Village Board of Trustees and the procedure for filling such vacancy. The Board will follow up at the next regular or special meeting.
